The ideas are projected in her series of carved book sculptures that symbolically represent overflowing information of the uneasy truth and the ignorance of the real facts behind big corporations which is concealed with the Media, thus leaving us as victims inclined to what is already set for us. Recycled materials such as abandoned books and leftover product packaging were used & collaged together in some of the carved book sculptures that revealed certain messages about what she have chosen for the audience to see. With the use of plywood as the basic surface for her installation, she took advantage of its rigidity to support the weight of her mixed media artworks and as an interesting way to display her presentation. Her idea of using recycled materials and packaging was to convince viewers the potential ways of being creative and innovative in portraying certain messages.

With a clever twist, her added work of Manipulative images depicting commercialization can be seen in one of the Images portraying the hypocrisy which lies in Big Corporation and one of them were Nestle, that carries the slogan of Good Food, Good Life transformed into "Good Food, Good Money" unveils the truth about how they continue making huge profit from their products through corruptions, creating trade wars, eco-disasters and so on. The thoughts of knowing that parts of our world are overpowered viewers through her artwork.

My capstone project is about digital imaging of the patterns and colours of butterfly wings. My idea arises from the recognizing the beauty of colours and patterns of butterfly wings found in Brunei. It is my intention to present new and fresh pattern designs inspired by local butterflies, which most of the people seem to ignore of the common beauty surrounded in our environment.


I have always been fascinated by photography, especially macro photography. I have taken a lot of macro photographs of butterflies and took advantage of my talent in computer graphics to design some new patterns by altering the butterfly wings' colour and patterns. I started to study different patterns and colours of different species butterfly wings by tracing and sketching them in my sketchbook. I applied my digital pattern designs merely on different surfaces, such as fabrics, tiles or household utensils as souvenir items for the butterfly garden. The setting material for displaying my souvenirs was mainly bamboo since bamboo was a natural organic form with unique pattern similar to butterfly wings. It helped to create a bonding between my digital fractal art with natural motif, butterfly wings, and the natural material.

My digital art project has changed my perception of nature and helped me in exploring deeper and further the patterns and colour of butterfly wings. As we know, nature is a never ending transformation process. Therefore, we should never overlook the order of nature.



The Black Gold Impact is an installation showcasing a series of imaged photos depicted distinctive scenarios on how crude oil affects our economy, infrastructure and living standard. There are 10 manipulated digital photos arranged in a certain order under five different categories: oil field, urban city, neighbourhood, rainforest and farm land. Each category portrayed two distinct opposite images due to the "black gold" impact.

All images are arranged on circular panels, symbolises running time and movement of life. The two life-size figures facing each other at the centre to represents a present adult handing a "torch" to a future child. The "torch" symbolises enlightenment of education, where with the power of education it may help to sustain our future economic development and stability. The installation is mainly made of jointed polyvinyl chloride pipes to represent the crude oil pipelines as the network in transporting the "black gold" throughout our nation. My installation suggests that it is the time for all of us to accept the reality that we will run out of our natural resource, crude oil, sometime in the future and it is all depended on our present effort in changing the future of our next generation.






Black Gold Impact




My Precious One







A subject matter was essential for any piece of artwork, so I thought of a particular object that meant a lot to me. The first thing that came to my mind was my red and blue backpack.
